Each year, students from high schools across Canada are selected to come to Ottawa to work as Pages in the House of Commons. Pages have the opportunity to learn about the House of Commons while witnessing the legislative process.

- be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident;
- be graduating from high school or CEGEP (with no academic interruptions) and starting full-time studies at one of the four universities in the National Capital Region in September of the year of employment as a Page;
- have obtained an overall academic average of at least 80% the previous year (Grade 11, or secondary IV, or your first year of CEGEP in Quebec), and subsequently maintain this average (transcripts to be provided); and
- be able to orally communicate fluently **in both official languages**, as evaluated by the House of Commons.

Value: From \$10,000 up to an amount sufficient to cover tuition and fees. Students must submit an application to SFU before applying to the entrance scholarship competition. Richmond Youth Media Program

The Richmond Youth Media Program (RYMP) is a free, referral-based program for youth ages 13-24. At RYMP, youth can work independently on media projects and attend a skill-building session on a different suggested topic every week. RYMP members are also given opportunities to do media-based outreach to other community groups, strengthening their relationships with Richmond resource providers while building experience in their fields of interest. The goal at RYMP is to provide a supportive environment where youth can engage with their peers and positive adult role models while learning the skills that they want to learn. RYMP sessions are held in the Richmond Media Lab, located inside the Richmond Cultural Centre at 7700 Minoru Gate, on Thursdays from 3-8pm and Saturdays from 12-4:30pm.
