Dionne M welcomed everyone to the meeting with the Land Acknowledgment.

Reminder to mute your microphones so as not to pick up background noises.

4. Principal's Report & answering pre- submitted parent questions

Mr. Johnstone welcomed everyone to tonight's meeting.

- Staffing Update

Retired TOC, Mr. Savory (Tech Ed Block A & B) is filling in for Ms. Crowe.

Counselling position still vacant, so we are still one counsellor short. Hopefully we will have a new counsellor by the end of November.

- Facility Update

There is still some minor vandalism happening. Graffiti with markers on some of the window shutters but not to the extent seen in the summer.

Lots of broken alcohol bottles on weekends and Monday mornings.

Security guards have eased off and we don't have one moving forward but will continue to monitor the situation.

- Grade 8 day

Will be on October 26th. It's been quite a challenge for Ms. Zaine and the leadership team to organise. There will be T-shirts, pizza from Pizza Factory for lunch and a lot of different activities. Hopefully the smoke will be gone as a lot of it will be outdoors. Emails will be going out to G8 parents with more details.

- Club Days

A great turnout with 44 Clubs in total. This is the most Mr. Johnstone has seen at any of his previous schools. Not enough space in the rotunda so had to present 22 over the 2 days. Clubs are still open for students to join throughout the year, see Mr. Ngo for details.

A reminder that for every club, there is ONE staff member volunteering their time. A big thank you to the teachers, EA's and CUPE staff as the clubs cannot run without them volunteering their time after 3pm.

- Ministry Reporting Order for Grades 8/9 changes effective next year

There will be no letter grades but will be using the Proficiency Scales from next year which is the same reporting as K-7. This was supposed to happen prior to the pandemic. There is a District information session on Oct 25th, 6pm on Zoom.

- New Graduation requirements effective 2024

For our current G11's and onwards: -

- The BC Ministry of Education and Child Care is implementing an Indigenous-focused graduation requirement for all secondary students beginning in the 2023/2024 school year.
- This transformative change to the Graduation Program represents an important next step toward lasting and meaningful reconciliation, providing all BC students with the necessary time and opportunity to develop deeper understandings of the experiences, cultures, and histories of Indigenous peoples in Canada.
- This new requirement also reflects ongoing work by the Ministry of Education and Child Care, First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC), and other education partners to build capacity within the education system to address Indigenous-specific racism.
- Involves secondary students completing 4 credits of Indigenous-focused coursework to graduate starting next academic year.

- Do not need to require more credits
- Students need to take 1 Indigenous focused course (4 credits)
 - English 12 First People's (Grads of 2024)
 - BC First People's 12 (will be the credit for English 12)
 - English 10 First People's
 - Board Authorized Classes (TBD)
 - o Possible Summer School courses, not yet decided
- Spreading #Wildcat Pride (Instagram and Twitter)

Japanese class went to Wisteria Place Seniors Home and did some activities with some of the Japanese elders there.

Senior Leadership team went to UBC Ropes Course in preparation for the Grade 8 day. The course was very challenging, but they managed to help each other out to finish the course.

- Questions from Parents from the Chat
 - 1. Wanting to know more about the English 12 course for next year, how to advise our children what courses to take for next school year.

A. This is new to us, but it will have a First Nations perspective. Not sure how it will all work but that is what we are working on now and will have more information later.

2. Where have the glass alcohol bottles been located over the weekends?

A. Mainly at the picnic table area at the front of the school. There are garbage cans there, but they are not being used.

3. When will the Homework Club be on?

A. Not yet decided, but there are a few options. Learning services are looking at using some senior students to volunteer for tutoring. From reading the interims, teachers are saying that the students should be using the PLT times for help.

5. RDPA Report

- After the BC Elections this past Saturday we have 7 new school trustees for the next 4 years and their swearing in ceremony will be at the District Board Meeting on November 9th. 6. Treasury Update - Jon / Winson (Co-treasurers)

- Amendment of Section 11.4 under Finances, of our Constitution – A change to the signing officers in line with the BC Gaming Grant. The constitution was sent out if you would like to follow along. The 2 signing officers need to be PAC members such as Chairperson, vice/co-Chairperson, Treasurer and one other executive member. All cheques will have 2 PAC signatures.

7. Gaming Grant - PAC Executive

Gaming Grant - 2022 staff requests - voting on approval of requests

- Jon L went through the requests. We have \$43,369.41 available in the gaming grant funds and the total Wishlist requests came to \$29,578.43. The Executive have broken down the requests into 3 blocks. Block 1 - Grad Requests, Block 2 - Returning Requestors, Block 3 - New Clubs or Departments making new requests. The Executive have made a proposal for the allocation of funds to be discussed and voted on tonight.

- We have been advised by the BC Gaming Commission that this is the last year that PAC Scholarships can come out of the gaming account. We usually give 7, \$500 scholarships each year.

- Questions from Parents
 - Concerns about the drone request from the Photography Club, further information is required on the rules in City of Richmond, YVR and Transport Canada on drone use. PAC will set aside contingent funds and with further investigation it will be decided during next PAC meeting.
