BLACK EXCELLENCE DAY - January 15

Black Excellence Day started from the movement of Black Shirt Day in early 2021. In consultation with various community members including the Centre of Israel and Jewish Affairs, the term “Black Shirt” was identified as causing harm and trauma for survivors of the Holocaust. Recognizing this, the movement Black Excellence Day was created in its place. The term “Black Excellence” was born out of the civil rights movement in the 1960s and honours great civil rights leader, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. who was born on January 15, 1929.
