JULY 15/24 The Looking Glass Foundation's Reflections Scholarship Deadline

At Looking Glass, we support individuals affected by eating disorders through accessible programs and services. Eligibility:

Permanent residents of British Columbia who are: Full-time students (3 or more classes) enrolled in an accredited post-secondary institution in Canada, who are commencing or returning to a university or college program starting between September 2024 - January 2025

Enrolled in their first undergraduate degree (graduate students and students who are completing a second undergraduate degree are not eligible to apply)

Currently accessing, or have previously accessed, support for an eating disorder and are far enough along in recovery to be able to meet the demands of their chosen program

Demonstrate a strong need for financial assistance in order to

JUL 26/24 4:00 PM Sangra Family Scholarship Deadline

Created to support students entering Langara College directly out of high school.

Eligibility Criteria:

Be entering Langara College as a full-time student in Fall Semester 2024.

Have completed high school in Vancouver, Richmond, or Burnaby within six months of starting at Langara College. Have participated on a high school sports team during Grade 11 and 12.

Have an academic standing of a minimum "B-" average in Grade 12, at the time of their application, as validated by their high school administrator or athletic director.

Demonstrate financial need.

JULY 31/24 Belairdirect Scholarship Program (sponsored by Johnson Inc.) Deadline

AUG 1/24 Horatio Alger Indigenous Achievement Scholarship Deadline

The Horatio Alger Indigenous Achievement Scholarship is for Indigenous students starting a four-year post-secondary program in the fall. This is a renewable award of \$2,500. While enrolled in post-secondary students must maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA and a full-time course load to receive the renewed support each year. Requirements: First Nation (status and nonstatus), Inuit, and Métis students must be in their final year of high school. Students whose home Indigenous community are in the Northwest or Yukon Territories or Nunavut. Enrolled fulltime in a high school within Canada at time of application. Must be starting in a four-year post-secondary program within Canada full-time in September. Have a valid Social Insurance Number. To apply go to here

AUG 1/24 Dennis McGann Bursary Deadline

The Columbia Foundation, the Canadian Union of Public Employees British Columbia (CUPE BC), the Canadian Association of Labour Media (CALM), The NOW Group, along with the McGann family, have established the Dennis McGann Bursary. This one-time bursary program is designed for those studying or planning to study Communications who demonstrate a commitment to the issues and actions affecting working people. One (1) \$1,000 bursary will be awarded to a Canadian Citizen or Landed Immigrant who is enrolling or enrolled in full or part time Communications studies at an accredited public post-secondary institution in Canada. Financial need must be demonstrated. This bursary also considers community service.

Aug 16/24 10:59 PST ATCO Indigenous Education Awards Program Deadline

The Merit, Bursary, Scholarship and Bridging Awards are available to select students who demonstrate leadership capabilities and strive to be role models in their school and community.

There are four different awards available:

Merit Awards (\$750) – for students completing Grades 10 – 12 Bursaries (\$1200) – for students enrolled in trade/community technical college diploma or certificate program

Scholarships (\$1800) – for students enrolled in degree or graduate programs

Bridging Awards (\$1000) – for students registered in an upgrading program (Adult Basic Education) or University Preparation program

Eligibility:

Self-identify as Indigenous in Canada (First Nations, Inuit, or Métis);

Are enrolled full-time in junior/senior high school (including upgrading) or an accredited post-secondary institution or training/certificate program;

Are not a child of an ATCO employee.

The Instructor/Lifeguard Subsidy Program (ILSP) provides training courses offered by the City to youth and adult residents (13+ years) who are experiencing financial hardship, and who are interested in a career or position as an Instructor/Lifeguard.

This program subsidizes eligible Richmond applicants up to 90% of the total course fees.
