ACTION ITEM: SCHOOL PARKING LOT/TRAFFIC SAFETY As a reminder, it takes all of us being traffic aware to ensure that our students, staff and parents are safe on our school grounds. We know how busy traffic can be in and around our school during peak times. There have been several near misses, incidents of cars driving too fast in our parking lot and, unfortunately, one recent incident of a driver caused injury to a pedestrian on Garry Street. We continue to work diligently to get the message out to our entire community that everyone must follow all traffic regulations when accessing the school grounds. Some important things to keep in mind include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> follow posted school zone speed limits on the road from dawn to dusk slow down when in the driveway and parking lot do not use surrounding complexes or driveways to drop off/pick up your child no left turns can be made out of the school driveway during peak traffic times, at the start and end of the school day. These times are 8:10am-9:45am and 2:45pm-3:20pm. We have also asked our RCMP partners to assist us with this. Administration will also be outside to help remind everyone as often as possible, but we need everyone's help with this. Thank you for your assistance and cooperation.																			
GRADUATION ASSESSMENTS – Jan. 12-16 January Graduation Assessments will run from January 12-16, 2026. During the January Graduation Assessment sessions, we will be running the following assessments: Graduation Numeracy Assessment 10 (GNA 10), Graduation Literacy Assessment 12 (GLA 12), and Évaluation de littératie (LTF 12). A schedule of when students will be writing the specific assessments has been posted outside the office and is attached. A reminder that students must bring all necessary materials, such as pencils, pens, erasers, calculator (if needed), and photo ID. Please arrive at your assessment location at least 10 minutes early.
